To extend the opportunity to as many schools and students across Melbourne we are accepting groups of between 3-10 students with 1-2 teachers from each school as per regional quotas below:

Regional Quota System - Limits on school numbers from across Yarra Catchment

Upper Yarra - 65 places will be accepted (approx 6-10 schools)
Middle Yarra - 65 places will be accepted (approx 6-10 schools)

Lower Yarra - 65 places will be accepted (approx 6-10 schools)

Other areas across Melbourne - 60 places will be accepted (approx 6-10 schools)
