Keynote Michael Phillips



Michael is currently the principal at Ringwood Secondary College, a position he has held since 1997.

In this role he has encouraged the innovative use of ICT as a vehicle for transforming teacher practice, student engagement and

student learning. Parallel to the college's involvement as a trial school for the Victorian DEECD Ultranet in 2007 was the introduction of a 1:1 laptop program for all students across years 9 to 11. In 2011 the college has introduced iPads without textbooks for all Year 7 students.

Michael has had the opportunity to present at conferences both in Australia and overseas.

Recent achievements have included being a finalist for the DEECD Excellence in Leadership Award in 2009 and the recipient of its Outstanding School Leader Award in 2010. He is also a Victorian fellow of ACEL.

Beyond his own school, Michael has been the Project leader for the Maroondah Regeneration Project.
